



Promoting Netball

In May 2019 the new home of indoor netball, Niagara Park Stadium, was launched with a Central Coast Heart exhibition match in front of more than 600 supporters.

Musical entertainment from the Gosford High School band created a great atmosphere for two exciting games against North Shore United Opens and Under 23s. It was a fabulous opportunity for local fans to meet the teams ahead of the 2019 season and experience elite netball on the coast. "



Central Coast Heart players and coaches conducted five playing skills clinics during 2019.

The clinics were conducted at four different venues during May-September 2019 for 150 young net ballers aged between 7-14.

This year there were 48 junior teams, 24 senior teams and 8 mixed teams (over 700 players and umpires) plus spectators at Adcock Park each week to enjoy the beautiful twilight evenings and have some fun at netball.

In the Metro League competition, the Central Coast Heart division 2 team finished in fifth position; and the division 6 team finished in second place and were grand finalists.

In the Premier League Central Coast Heart finished fifth in the Under 23s, while the Open team were minor premiers and grand finalists.


Head coach, Amber Cross, then went on to win the Sport NSW 2019 Community Coach of the Year (with

Central Coast Heart is proud to partner with Central Coast Leagues, the Central Coast community branches of Bendigo Bank and the Imperial Centre Gosford.


